St John Henry Newman: co-patron of the Church's educational mission with Dr Paul Shrimpton

About our topic: John Henry Newman (1801-1890), was a clergyman, theologian, academic and educator. He said *"from first to last, education, in this large sense of the word, has been my line"*. He was a leading Anglican, and then, in 1845, was received into the Catholic Church and became a leading Catholic. He was responsible for the foundation of a university and a school . He wrote extensively on education, and is probably the most important Catholic theologian to have written in English . He was canonised in 2019 and declared a Doctor of the Church and co-patron of Catholic education in 2025.

About our speaker: Paul Shrimpton is a graduate of Balliol College, Oxford, and has taught at Magdalen College School, Oxford for 40 years. He has been researching and publishing on Newman's educational ideas and practice for three decades and published *A Catholic Eton? Newman's Oratory School* (2005) and *The 'Making of Men': the Idea and Reality of Newman's university in Oxford and Dublin* (2014).
