
Philip Pullman is an accomplished and prolific author, best known for the "His Dark Materials" fantasy trilogy, that has been adapted for stage, film and television. He is almost equally famous as a critic of religion and especially Christianity, albeit one who acknowledges the cultural influence of it. He described himself as a "Church of England...and Book of Common Prayer atheist". He has claimed to be "of the Devil's party" (after Milton).

Does the Golden Compass point to God? Do those looking through the Amber Spyglass glimpse Sion?
